Public Service Commissioner Tony O'Donnell participated in a press conference, held April 29, 2020 for the purpose of promoting a process that would be favorable to Montana Utilities in moving ahead with a proposed purchase of Colstrip Unit 4. The purchase is the subject of an application for approval of capacity resource application by NorthWestern Energy now pending with the Public Service Commission.

The Billings Gazette's reporter Tom Lutey quotes Public Service Commissioner Tony O'Donnell in his Missoulian story of 5/2/20: "This is a PR bonanza for them," O'Donnell said of the (Colstrip) owners. They can say 'We caused the problem and now we are fixing the problem by turning waste to wealth.'" O'Donnell was referring to an unproven, untested proposal by the Tennessee company RamRock to turn the toxic Colstrip coal ash waste into concrete. Montana's DEQ has not received the required Beneficial Use Determination for this proposal. Talen Energy has expressed "...serious concerns about the technical feasibility and financial viability of their proposal that RamRock has not yet sufficiently addressed,..."

O'Donnell's appearance and statements at a press conference constitute a promotional effort in favor of NorthWestern Energy's purchase of Colstrip Unit 4. It is unethical for a PSC Commissioner to publicly advocate in favor of a party (NorthWestern Energy) with an application pending with the Commission, particularly regarding an untested, unproven process that would make the party's application appear more favorable in the PSC application review process.

PSC Commissioners are ethically bound to protect and support Montana ratepayers, not to promote the status of the utilities they regulate.
