| Bondy v. Hiatt | FINDING OF SUFFICIENT FACTS TO |

| No. COPP 2021-CFP-007 | SUPPORT A CAMPAIGN PRACTICE ACT VIOLATION |

On April 5, 2021, Lloyd Bondy of Lakeside, Montana filed a campaign practices complaint against Will Hiatt. The complaint alleges that the respondent failed to properly register as a candidate with the COPP despite participating as a candidate for election in past school trustee election.

SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES ADDRESSED

The proper and timely filing as a candidate with the Commissioner of Political Practices office.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The foundational facts necessary for this Decision are as follows:

<u>Finding of Fact No. 1</u>: Will Hiatt is a current member of the Kalispell School District #5 Board of Education.¹ (Commissioner's Records.)

<u>Finding of Fact No. 2</u>: On May 5, 2020, Kalispell School District #5 held a school trustee election. (Commissioner's Records.)

Finding of Fact No. 3: On April 7, 2021, Kalispell School District #5's Director of Business Services Gwyn Anderson emailed the COPP a copy of a Declaration and Oath of Candidacy for Trustee Candidates signed by Will Hiatt and dated March 19, 2020, signaling his participation as a candidate in the Kalispell School

District's May 5, 2020, school trustee election. A copy of a hard copy (paper) C-1A signed by candidate Hiatt was also included. While the C-1A was signed and dated March 19, 2020, it was not provided to the COPP by candidate Hiatt at that time. Finally, the email included a copy of a Certificate of Election of Trustee by Acclimation issued May 12, 2020, stating that candidate Hiatt "was duly elected by acclamation to fill the office of Trustee". (Commissioner's Records).

At no time did candidate Hiatt file a C-1A Statement of Candidate as a candidate for election to a school trustee position in Kalispell School District #5's May 5, 2020, election with the COPP. (Commissioner's Records.)

<u>Finding of Fact No. 4</u>: Kalispell School District #5 did not provide the COPP with a list of candidates who had registered to participate in the May 5, 2020, election at any time prior to the completion of that election, nor a list of winning candidates after the completion of that election. (Commissioner's Records.)

<u>Finding of Fact No. 5</u>: On April 7, 2021, Kalispell School District #5 Director of Business Services Gwyn Andersen contacted the COPP via email. The email reads:

I am in need of some clarification on the campaign practices as they relate to school district trustees.

As I stated in an earlier email, in the past I have printed the C1a form and ask the candidates to complete it and return it to me so that I knew they had done the paperwork. I then sent them on to the commissioner of political practices office in one mailing.

In the cases of the election being cancelled, because there was only one candidate for each open seat I did not send the paperwork on to the COPP office, because the election was cancelled. No election, no campaign, no campaign finance reports. That may have been my error.

Now of course it is an electronic only process. Going forward should I be advising them to complete that information even though the election has been cancelled?

Thank you for your guidance.

(Commissioner's Records.)

DISCUSSION

The complaint alleges Will Hiatt failed to register with the COPP as candidate for a 2020 school trustee election.

Mont. Code Ann. §13-37-201 requires that candidates seeking election to public office register as such with the COPP "within 5 days after becoming a candidate". While some school trustee candidates are exempted from this requirement under Mont. Code Ann. §13-37-206(1), Kalispell School District #5 is not among the exempted districts. School trustee candidates in Kalispell School District #5 need to register as a candidate with the COPP under applicable Montana campaign finance law.

In this matter, Kalispell School District #5 confirmed that Will Hiatt had registered with the district as a candidate for election to a school trustee position in 2020 (FOF No. 3) Mr. Hiatt became a candidate as the term is defined under Mont. Code Ann. §13-1-101(8) by filing a Declaration and Oath of Candidacy for Trustee candidates with the school district signaling their intent to run as a candidate for election to a school trustee position in a given election.

Will Hiatt became a candidate in the Kalispell School District #5's May 5, 2020 school trustee election on March 19, 2020 by filing a Declaration and Oath of Candidacy for Trustee Candidates with the school district (FOF No. 3). While candidate Hiatt appears to have completed and signed a hard copy C-1A Statement of Candidate indicating his candidacy in that election, he did not provide this document to the COPP (FOF No. 3). Candidate Hiatt failed to meet

the requirements of Mont. Code Ann. §13-37-201 by failing to register as a candidate with the COPP for a 2020 election in which he had participated as a candidate. Candidate Hiatt's failure to timely file a Statement of Candidate is a violation of statutory requirements of Mont. Code Ann. §13-37-201.

<u>Sufficiency Finding No. 1</u>: Candidate Hiatt failed to file his Statement of Candidate with the COPP within 5 days of becoming a 2020 candidate for Kalispell School District #5 Trustee as required by Montana law.

The Commissioner finds candidate Hiatt failed to properly and timely file a C-1A Statement of Candidate with the COPP indicating his candidacy for a 2020 school trustee position, a Montana campaign practices violation.

After the completion of the election in which he had participated in, candidate Hiatt was issued a Certificate of Election of Trustee by Acclimation by Kalispell School District #5, indicating that he had been "duly elected by acclimation to fill the office of Trustee" (FOF Nos. 3).

At no time was the COPP notified that candidate Hiatt had registered as a candidate for election to a school trustee position with the Kalispell School District #5. Had the COPP been made aware of the candidacy, the agency would have contacted the individual immediately to notify of their requirement to register on forms filed with the COPP and provide any necessary assistance in completing this process, as it routinely does with all candidates.

Ultimate responsibility in meeting the requirements of Mont. Code Ann. §13-37-201, falls on the candidate, not the COPP or any other entity or agency which the candidate interacts with. Like any other candidate, school trustee candidates assume all responsibility for complying with applicable Montana

campaign finance law regardless of what contact (if any) the candidate has with COPP staff.

DECISION

The Commissioner has limited discretion when making the determination as to an unlawful campaign practice. First, the Commissioner "shall investigate" any alleged violation of campaign practices law. Mont. Code Ann. § 13-37-111(2)(a). The mandate to investigate is followed by a mandate to take action; where there is "sufficient evidence" of a violation the Commissioner must ("shall notify," see id., at § 13-37-124) initiate consideration for prosecution.

Second, having been charged to make a decision, the Commissioner must follow substantive law applicable to a particular campaign practice decision. This Commissioner, having been charged to investigate and decide, hereby determines that there is sufficient evidence to show that candidate Hiatt violated Montana's campaign practice laws, including, but not limited to the laws set out in the Decision. Having determined that sufficient evidence of a campaign practice violation exists, the next step is to determine whether there are circumstances or explanations that may affect prosecution of the violation and/or the amount of the fine.

The failure to fully and timely report and disclose cannot generally be excused by oversight or ignorance. Excusable neglect cannot be applied to oversight or ignorance of the law as it relates to failures to file and report. See Matters of Vincent, Nos. COPP-2013-CFP-006, 009 (discussing excusable

neglect principles). Likewise, the Commissioner does not normally accept that failures to file or report be excused as *de minimis*. *Id.* (discussing *de minimis* principles).

Because there is a finding of violation and a determination that *de minimis* and excusable neglect theories are not applicable to the above Sufficiency Findings, a civil fine is justified. Mont. Code Ann. § 13-37-124. The Commissioner hereby issues a "sufficient evidence" Finding and Decision justifying a civil fine or civil prosecution of candidate Hiatt. Because of the nature of the violation, this matter is referred to the County Attorney of Lewis and Clark County for his consideration as to prosecution. *Id.*, at (1). Should the County Attorney waive the right to prosecute (*id.*, at (2)) or fail to prosecute within 30 days (*id.*, at (1)) this Matter returns to this Commissioner for possible prosecution.

Most of the Matters decided by a Commissioner and referred to the County Attorney are waived back to the Commissioner for his further consideration. Assuming that the Matter is waived back, this Finding and Decision does not necessarily lead to civil prosecution as the Commissioner has discretion ("may then initiate" see id.) in regard to a legal action. Instead, most of the Matters decided by a Commissioner are resolved by payment of a negotiated fine. In setting that fine the Commissioner will consider matters affecting mitigation, including the cooperation in correcting the issue when the matter was raised in the Complaint.

While it is expected that a fine amount can be negotiated and paid, in the event that a fine is not negotiated and the Matter resolved, the Commissioner retains statutory authority to bring a complaint in district court against any person who intentionally or negligently violates any requirement of campaign practice law, including those of Mont. Code Ann. § 13-37-201. See id., at § 13-37-128. Full due process is provided to the alleged violator because the district court will consider the matter de novo.


