According to COPP Candidate Forms Guide [reference Title 13, Chapters 35 and 37 Montana Code Annotated (2021)], a form C-1A must be filed within five days after any of these events first occur: money is received or spent, a campaign treasurer is appointed, or the candidate files for office. Candidate Miller filed at the Beaverhead County Courthouse in January 2022 and his registration on COPP via CERS was dated 3/15/22. This is longer than five days.

MCA 13-37-229 states candidates not spending less than \$500 must file periodic reports disclosing campaign contributions and expenditures....

Candidate Miller filed that he would spend less than \$500, however, the filing fee for candidacy of \$275 was paid, \$120 for printed ads in the locally distributed advertiser (Dillonite Daily) and four ads were placed in the Dillon Tribune (local newspaper) and a campaign banner was purchased and hung locally. From funding another local campaign, it is known that these expenditures add up to greater than \$500.

MCA 13-37-226 states....a candidate shall file reports required by 13-37-225 (1)(a)...as follows.... (b)...the 20th day of March, April, May, June....in the year of an election in which the candidate participates.

Candidate Miller did not have campaign finance reports filed at the March, April, May deadlines available for public review by the time of the election on June 7, 2022.

All election materials are required by 13-35-225, MCA, to clearly and conspicuously include the appropriate attribution language. To ensure compliance with this statutory directive, the Commissioner established the following requirements and specifications:

- 1. (a)For election materials financed by a candidate or a candidate 's campaign, the attribution must include either:
- The name and address of the candidate: or
- The name and address of the candidate's campaign.

Candidate Miller's newspaper ads did not provide the address of the candidate or his campaign. See enclosed ads.

Complaints must be:

- signed
- notarized
- · delivered in person or by mail.

COPP Candidate Forms Guide

The following is a list of report forms available to candidates from the Office of the Commissioner of Political Practices and a brief description of what each form is and where and when the form must be filed:

- **C-1 Statement of Candidate**: Form C-1 is the Statement of Candidate for candidates for statewide or state district (House, Senate, PSC, and District Judge) seats. Form C-1 must be filed within five days after receiving/soliciting campaign contributions, making campaign expenditures or filing for office, whichever occurs first. The C-1 Statement of Candidate must be filed electronically using the <u>CERS system</u>.
- C-1A Statement of Candidate: Form C-1A is the Statement of Candidate for county, municipal (city), or school candidates. All county and municipal candidates must file form C-1A; all candidates campaigning for school trustee offices in first-class districts located in counties with populations of 15,000 and more or in county high school districts having student enrollments of 2,000 or more must file a Form C-1A. Form C-1A must be filed within five (5) days after receiving/soliciting campaign contributions, making campaign expenditures or filing for office, whichever occurs first. 'B' box (the campaign will not exceed \$500 in contribution or expenditure activity) or 'C' box (the campaign will exceed \$500 in contribution or expenditure activity). A C-1 Statement of Candidate must be filed electronically using the CERS system.
- **C-3 Code of Fair Campaign Practices**: Form C-3 is the Code of Fair Campaign Practices. Candidates may file form C-3 with the COPP at any time, but it is a voluntary form and is not required. Form C-3 can be filed in the <u>CERS system</u>.
- C-5 Candidate Campaign Finance Report: Form C-5 is the candidate campaign finance reporting form and must be filed by all statewide and state district candidates as well as all county, municipal (city), and school candidates that have designated themselves 'C' box candidates on the C-1A. C5 reports must detail all contributions received and expenditures made by a campaign during the reporting period. C5s are filed periodically according to the reporting calendar- see the Reporting Calendars page on the COPP's website for up to date information about campaign reporting calendars. Candidates must file form C-5 electronically using the CERS system.


