What are the laws and rules governing campaigning on the Internet by a candidate or a political committee?

A website utilized by a candidate or political committee to advocate the success or defeat of a candidate or issue is categorized as election material.

The costs associated with the development and maintenance of the website should be reported in the same manner as costs associated with the production of brochures, bumper stickers, print ads, and other forms of advertising.

The disclaimer provisions of Montana Code Annotated § 13-35-225 would also apply.
