



In reviewing the C5 reports on the Madison County Commissioner Candidates. I noticed that Dan Allman and Ellis Thompson had reported that they both had paid for their ads for the running of County Commissioner during primary.

In reviewing David Schulz's C5 reports, I have observed that there are no expenses listed for his political ads that were posted in the Madisomian. There are four 1/4 page ads, May 12th, 19th and 26th. In June there was the 2nd (which is a 1/8 page ad) and an ad on June 16th. I noticed that these ads all say they are paid for by Matt Hall, Treas, with the exception of May 26th, which claims Nancy Schulz is the Treasurer. I know the cost for that type of a 1/4 page, is \$149.25, which totals \$597.00. The 1/8 page would be half.

In knowing that Mr Schulz's daughter is listed as co-owner of the Madisomian, as this a favor, an in kind contribution that is not listed or an oversight on Mr Schulz's part. I thought it was strange that nothing was listed for these ads.



can freeze and thaw. When carrying this protection, make sure it's in a place where you can't drop it, and most of all, whether it's for hiking, riding or biking, ensure that you can get at it quickly. Do not stuff the can in your pack or put it on the outside of your pack in a place that's hard to reach. For these purposes, a holster is best. You can also use a fanny pack that has water bottle holders on it for quick access. If a bear is charging, you have very little time to act. A holster works well because they're set up so you can actually fire the can while it's still in place.

And make sure when you buy your bear spray, that you know how to use it before you leave the store.




