Pursuant to 13-35-225(3), MCA, I am submitting the following attribution statement for the text messages described below:

“Paid for by ACLU of Montana, Alex Rate, Treasurer, PO Box 1968, Missoula, MT 59806.”

The ACLU of Montana will distribute the following text messages on November 1, 2024, to approximately 6,000 individuals (each of the initial texts will be distributed to approximately 2,000 individuals):

Next Tuesday, your vote for State House District 41 and State Senate District 21 could affect Native voting rights in Montana. Jade Sootkis of Northern Cheyenne and Sharon Stewart Peregoy of Crow Agency have pledged to preserve election-day voter registration and to protect and expand on-reservation access to voting. When asked if they would support these bills, Dean Wallowingbull of Crow Agency and Gayle Lammers refused to respond. Check the facts at aclumontana.org/2024 [aclumontana.org]. Sidney “Chip” Fitzpatrick of Crow Agency and Sharon Stewart Peregoy of Crow Agency have pledged to preserve election-day voter registration and to protect and expand on-reservation access to voting.
