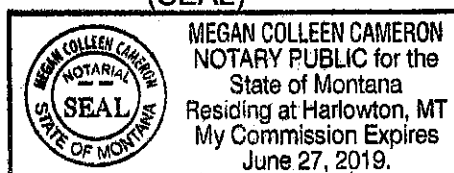

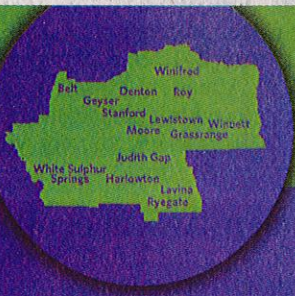
I am writing to file a complaint for violations of Montana law by Hertha Lund. I am attaching to this complaint a copy of the ads Ms. Lund created and paid \$556 for in the Lewistown News Argus on Saturday, May 7th, as well as \$435 for in the Harlowton Times Clarion on May 12th. Ms. Lund has violated Montana law by making statements about my voting record without providing a reference to the particular vote or votes upon which the information is based as required by 13-35-225(3)(a), MCA. In addition, Ms. Lund has failed to provide a statement, signed as provided in subsection (3)(b), that to the best of the signer's knowledge, the statements made about the other candidate's voting record are accurate and true as required by 13-35-225(3), MCA.

Ms. Lund's ad includes many misrepresentations of the truth as well as outright lies. None of her claims are cited with the Bill numbers and votes she is referring to.

Ms. Lund's representations about my voting record are flagrantly false. I would request that you seek an appropriate fine against Ms. Lund for these violations of Montana law.

In 1980, Ryan was born in Iowa.

Hertha helped draft and pass five bills specifically for landowners, rural counties and private property rights. She has 25 years of experience working for agriculture organizations to protect water and private property rights.

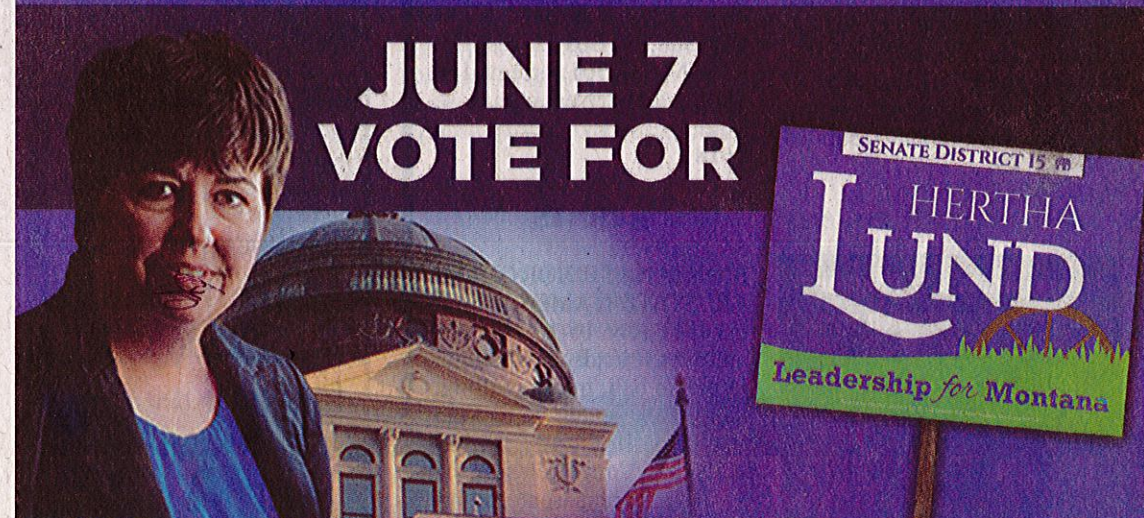
